

SANTIAGO, CHILE, 18 - 22 July 2016

Regional training on Health in All Policies in Chile focus was to enhance the competencies and abilities in the development, application, monitoring, and evaluation of intersectoral action of professionals from Ministries of Health in the Region of the Americas. This course sought to promote the intersectoral approach in the many programs and activities of the Ministries of Health while also supporting the planning and implementation of social policies to improve health equity in the Region.

The course covered two core aspects from the training manual: introduction into Health in All Policies concept and implementation issues.



 - What aspect of the training you participed in do you remember and implement most in your work?
- Data will be analysed by stakeholders groups: government, academia, other non-state actors

- To provide inputs if monitoring some country cases




