REGIONAL TRAINING ON HEALTH IN ALL POLICIES CHILE

SANTIAGO, CHILE, 18 – 22 July 2016

Regional training on Health in All Policies in Chile focus was to enhance the competencies and abilities in the development, application, monitoring, and evaluation of intersectoral action of professionals from Ministries of Health in the Region of the Americas. This course sought to promote the intersectoral approach in the many programs and activities of the Ministries of Health while also supporting the planning and implementation of social policies to improve health equity in the Region.

The course covered two core aspects from the training manual: introduction into Health in All Policies concept and implementation issues.

The training outcomes:

- ✓ Strong synergy and fostered experiences exchange among participants;
- ✓ Enhanced intersectoral action competencies and abilities of the health professionals in the Region;
- ✓ Enhanced integration of health and social policies to improve health equity in the Region.

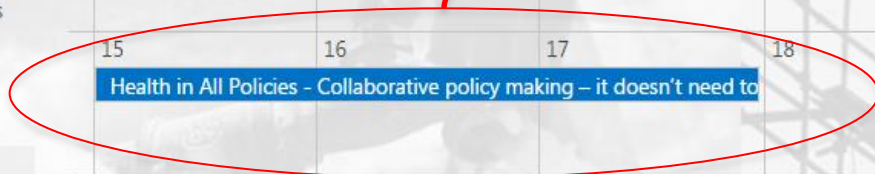
